

Township News: Results of the 2021 Avon Township Election & an update on the Annual Meeting

Tuesday, March 9, was a big day for Avon Township residents. It was the date of the annual Township election and annual meeting of Township residents.

The polls were open from 2-8 PM. Rich Sanoski was elected to a three-year term as Supervisor and Kelly Martini was elected to a two-year term as Treasurer. The turnout was small – 111 voters or 7.4% of registered voters – compared to the General Election this past November where more than 90% of registered voters participated.

We are especially grateful to our election judges (Deb Angulski, Jay Hedlund, Lisa Gilk, Marion Gondringer, Sue Rushmeyer, Stephen Saupe) for their service. Thankfully the majority of voters wore masks to protect themselves, the judges, and other voters from COVID-19.

Following the election, the Annual Meeting was convened. Due to COVID-19, this meeting was held virtually via Zoom. Following some reports, a motion was made to continue the meeting on June 8, 2021 at 7:00 PM at the Avon Town Hall to give residents a chance to meet together in a socially-distanced manner and to be able to more easily vote. The most important vote that will be held at the meeting will be related to the levy – residents will vote to approve their tax levy for 2022.
