Minutes of the Meeting of the Avon Township Planning Board

October 20, 2008

Avon City Hall

<u>Call to Order</u>: A special meeting of the Avon Township Planning Board was called to order by Chairman Ken Mergen at 8:00 P.M. This meeting was held jointly with the Board of Supervisors.

<u>Pledge</u>: Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Roll Call</u>: Present – Gerry Kremers, Ken Mergen, Roger Nelson, Lowell Rushmeyer and Stephen Saupe. Supervisors LeRoy Gondringer and John Merdan were also present, as was Clerk Renee Smith.

<u>Business</u>

This special joint meeting of the Avon Township Planning Board and Avon Township Board of Supervisors was requested by Ms. Susan Mauderer to expedite a request for a variance to site a modular home closer to the road (17 feet from the right-of-way or 41 feet from the centerline) than is currently permitted. Ms. Mauderer lives on 368th St. on 2.5 lots on Pelican Lake. She purchased at the State Fair a modular home to replace the existing mobile home. To fit the home on the site and meet lake setbacks, Ms. Mauderer must also reduce in size a pavilion that is on the site. Fire code dictates the home be 10 feet from the pavilion.

Mergen read aloud email letters in support of the proposed variance by Craig & Colleen Blonigen, Ronald Cheney, and Gordon & Barbara Blais. No other public comments, either positive or negative, were received.

The situation is complicated because according to Gondringer 368th is a public road that is privately maintained. In addition, Ms. Mauderer shared a schematic showing the placement of the home and septic. Board members noted that part of the septic system will be in the road right-of-way, which is a Country issue.

The possibility of vacating 368th was discussed.

Mergen moved to recommend to the Board of Supervisors to grant a variance to Susan Mauderer to place a modular home 17' from the road right-of-way, contingent upon the proposed plan meeting all pertinent county requirements and providing reasonable use of the property consistent with the neighbors. Kremer seconded. Unanimously approved.

<u>Adjournment</u>: Rushmeyer moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:23 PM. Mergen seconded. Approved unanimously. Following adjournment, the Board of Supervisors met to discuss the recommendation of the Planning Board.
